In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God. (John 1:1)

A few years ago, I was asked by a good friend to preside over the memorial service of a cousin of hers, in Des Moines. The pastor of their church was on vacation at the time. It ended up being a very small gathering of devoted friends along with my friend and her husband, who were the only living relatives able to attend.

After visiting with my friend about her cousin, I learned that although he had been a lifelong member of the church, he had not attended in many years and had spoken very little of his belief in God. The

last week or so of his life he had been hospitalized and not able to communicate very well.

However, at the memorial service, a couple of his friends who had visited him in the hospital that last week of his life mentioned that they could hear him repeating over and over a prayer that he had learned as a child: "Now I lay me down to sleep, I pray the Lord my soul to keep. If I should die before I wake, I pray the Lord my soul to take."

It occurred to me that in spite of the fact that church had not been a big part of his adult life, the Holy Spirit had, in this man's final days, moved him to a place where he did have a connection to God; this prayer that he had learned as a child. This prayer was his personal Word from God. It made me realize the importance of knowing God's Word. It's our connection with the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in this life. God's Word is filled with everything that can guide us, teach us, and comfort us in all areas of our life – the good times and certainly the bad times! God's Word truly is, as the psalmist said, "A lamp to my feet and a light to my path." (Psalm 119)

We have plenty of ways for you to meditate on God's Word during this season of Lent. There is (at both churches) a table in the fellowship hall with a plethora of Lenten devotionals free for you to take home. We have a Wednesday night meal and worship/study throughout Lent in which we discuss the Feasts if Israel and how it ties into Jesus' life and ministry. I am also doing a brief Lenten devotion on our Facebook pages Monday–Friday, along with daily scripture reading that will take us through the entire Bible in one year. And of course, we continue to worship every Sunday! Want to join me?
